DID YOU KNOW?

Before Julia Child and Martha Stewart, there was LaGrange's own Annabelle Dawson Hill. In 1867, Hill published a cookbook entitled, "Mrs. Hill's Cookbook, a Practical System for Families in Town and Country." This extremely popular cookbook gave instructions on how to slaughter the holiday bird, how to prepare treatments for common illnesses and how to set the table for dinner guests.
