LaGrange, Ga. October 15, 2020 – A City of LaGrange utility crew is in Kaplan, Louisiana assisting with power restoration following the damage caused by Hurricane Delta.

The crew travelled to Louisiana Thursday, October 8th and plan to return back home Friday, October 16th. Hurricane Delta made landfall Friday evening, October 9th as a Category 2 storm according to the

National Weather Service. The landfall was just 13 miles east of where Hurricane Laura hit. Another City of LaGrange crew assisted in the power restoration in Welsh, Louisiana following Hurricane Laura several weeks ago.
