Schachter's 14 year old son Alex was one of the 17 victims murdered in the Parkland school shooting on Valentine's Day 2018. He will share his in-depth knowledge of the failures, lessons learned, and measures taken to make Florida's schools safer after the Parkland massacre.

Schachter's unique style of presentation shows his pain, vulnerability, and unrelenting drive for accountability since his son's murder. The audience will come away from hearing Max speak with a rejuvenated determination to do everything they can to help keep Troup County Schools safe.
