Bussey was presented the Humane Law Enforcement Award by the Humane Society of the United States Georgia State Director Debra Berger at Tuesday evening's City Council meeting.

"Chris Bussey is being honored because he not only expanded and

improved his position but he helped to provide other opportunities for other law enforcement agencies to experience professional development by organizing law enforcement programs," said Berger. In November, the City of LaGrange Animal Services Department hosted free training to law enforcement and animal control officers from across the state to learn more about address animal cruelty and dog fighting.

"We are extremely proud of Chris," said LPD Chief Lou Dekmar. "Under his leadership we have developed
