When the LaGrange City Hall was built in the late 1920's several items were laid in the cornerstone of the building including contractor tabulations, three newspapers the LaGrange Reporter, the LaGrange Shuttle, and the LaGrange Graphic, leaflets about schools, churches, population, streets, and public utilities, a Bible, and a copy of the book *Americanism* by John Jones. This book described the role of Troup County in World War 1.
