LPD Animal Services Recovers Thirty Dogs in Hoarding Investigation

LaGrange, Ga. June 3, 2019 – Most of the Mastiff mixed breed dogs recovered in Friday's hoarding investigation are available for adoption at the LaGrange Animal Shelter. Several puppies have been adopted.



Nine puppies were recovered in the investigation

The adoption fee for all the dogs and puppies associated with this case is \$75. Some adult dogs will not be available for adoption until they are more trusting of people.

Because of the space issues created by this case, LaGrange Animal Services is waiving fees on all other dogs and cats who are fixed, microchipped, and current on vaccinations.

Animal Services crews worked with LPD Code Enforcement, LPD Community Outreach, City Community Development, Troup County Marshall's Office, and Hogansville Police on this investigation on North Barnard Avenue in LaGrange.

Investigators have declared the residence unfit for human habitation.

The owner of the residence surrendered the dogs to Animal Services.
